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### Reflections from father's desk...



Tradition has been rather unkind to St. Thomas, the apostle, by calling him the 'doubting disciple'. In fact, Thomas, the greatest doubter, becomes the greatest believe. No other apostle has been recorded as having made such a personal, passionate and profound profession of faith as when he exclaimed: "My Lord and My God!"

In order to believe, Thomas wanted to feel the scars of the wounds in the hands and side of Jesus. Thomas wanted to experience the real risen Jesus. And the real risen Jesus always remains a Jesus who is scarred with the wounds of his passion. We need to pause, ponder and pray. At times, unlike Thomas, are tempted to want a transfigured and triumphant Jesus whose glory dazzles and dazes. But the post resurrection Jesus is always a scarred Jesus seasoned, scoured and stamped with suffering. We need to ponder our own woundedness without feeling ashamed or embarrassed, showing Jesus our scars and asking him to feel and heal them. We are all wounded. We have been wounded perhaps as children by the kind of traumas that we have gone through; wounded at times by those in authority and elders, who penalized and punished us, unwittingly perhaps, but with veiled vindictive violence; wounded by our own past mistakes and misdeeds which are well beyond recall and remedy. Our woundedness only corroborates and confirms our reality.



### Catholic Monthly Devotions: A History

Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The Church traditionally encouraged the month of April for increased devotion to Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. "The Church in the course of the centuries has introduced various forms of this Eucharistic worship which are ever increasing in beauty and helpfulness; as, for example, visits of devotion to the tabernacles, even every day; Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament; solemn processions, especially at the time of Eucharistic Congresses, which pass through cities and villages; and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament publicly exposed . . . These exercises of piety have brought a wonderful increase in faith and supernatural life to the Church militant upon earth and they are re-echoed to a certain extent by the Church triumphant in heaven, which sings continually a hymn of praise to God and to the Lamb 'Who was slain.'" —Pope Pius XII


