REFLECTIONS FROM FATHER'S DESK...

"WHAT CAN WE OFFER JESUS? While Christmas reveals Jesus to the Jews represented by the shepherds, Epiphany manifests Him to the gentile world, represented by the Magi, the wise men from the east. They saw the star. Being wise, they read the signs of the time. They followed the sign till they found Jesus, the Reality to which the sign pointed.

It was not easy journey. But they pursued the star and persevered in their search till the star rested over the where the child was. And seeing the star "they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy." Joy must be the first sign of a real genuine encounter with Jesus!

Going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and fell down and worshipped him. This must be our response in the presence of Jesus. We must fall on our knees knowing who He is and who we are.

That is what Mary did, not just as she listened to the shepherds who hastened to the crib and returned glorifying and praising God for all that they had heard and seen but always, may we learn from Mary to look, to listen and to learn as God enters our lives. 2nd Sunday of O.T. (B)

"THE LOOK OF JESUS: "Jesus looked at him and said, 'You are Simon the son of John. You shall be called Cephas' (which means Peter)." This look of Jesus was a look of choice. It entailed a calling for Jesus had plans for Peter. He would commission him to continue His mission to be the Rock who would give stability, strength and solidity as head of the college of the apostles. This look of Jesus must have brought Peter immense joy and excitement. However, in another scene during the passion, Jesus looks straight at Peter as he denies him. This second look was of compassion brought Peter sorrow and disappointment. Peter wept bitterly. Tradition has it that tears caused furrows in peter's cheeks.

Peter indeed was the rock but what a porous rock he was! He just collapsed and crumbled before a servant girl and three times denied Jesus. Sadly, as the gospel records "Peter followed at a distance." If we are to be faithful to Jesus we need to follow him very closely. When there is a distance between us and Jesus, we are very likely to go our own way and worse still lose sight and track of Jesus. The more we do so, the wider the distance becomes. When Jesus calls and chooses us, He knows us inside out: our strengths and weaknesses, our assets and liabilities.

Happiness is not the absence of problems; it's the ability to deal with them.

3rd Sunday of O.T. (B)

<u>"THE CALL OF THE FIRST FOUR DISCIPLES:</u> Simon and Andrew, James and John: two sets of Brothers, a common profession called by Jesus to a common vocation from being fishermen to being fishers of men. We are struck by the succinctness of the call from Jesus. Just two words: "Follow Me" and the promptitude of their response. They leave their nets immediately and follow Jesus. They do not debate, discuss, delay, dither or dillydally. They leave their boats and their nets and their father and their fellow fishermen and follow the Master.

Jesus offers them no map. Following him is not an ideology. It rather demands that we follow him. We must be so we are so fascinated by Jesus that we are prepared to give up everything and cling to and give to him. Where Jesus would be leading these first four disciples? They do not know. Often in life, we do not know when Jesus is leading us. That is not important and does not matter. What really is important and matters is to know that Jesus is leading us.

Jesus calls the first four disciples even as they are engaged in their daily work. It is in the "scriptures" of our daily ordinary lives that Jesus speaks to and calls us. It is there that we must learn to and look for him.

If you have a strong purpose in life, you don't have to be pushed. Your passion will drive you there.

4th Sunday of O.T. (B)

<u>"AUTHORITY OVER EVIL:</u> It is somewhat strange but significant that even in their synagogue there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit. Even holy places are not exempt from evil influences. But why does St. Mark insert the word "their"? Was what taking place there in their synagogue was not really true teaching and worship? What is because Jesus specifically went to their synagogue because it needed cleansing and purification?

Moses had alluded to a prophet to come who would speak with authority. That prophecy is fulfilled in the Gospel as recorded by St. Mark. Jesus is preaching in the synagogue. He preaches not like the scribes and Pharisees. He preaches with authority. The scribes and Pharisees cited the word of God. Jesus is the Word of God. Even the unclean spirit in the man in that synagogue who was possessed recognizes Jesus and shouts: "What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? I know who you are: the Holy One of God!"

When we feel enslaved by evil and unable to break loose from the shackles of sin that bind us, we need to recall and remember that we have in Jesus a powerful God and a merciful Saviour! What power and authority Jesus displays as he exorcises that possessed man! When the Evil One tries, we must have recourse to Jesus who liberates us.

Certain things in life simply have to be experienced and never explained. Love is such a thing.




