Reflections from Fathers Desk... x 2

THE SOWER WENT OUT TO SOW." (MT.13:24-43): On this 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we are approximately half way through the Church's Liturgical Year. It is fitting for us to take stock, to assess the state of our garden. We check what plants are blooming, what crops are bearing fruit, what unwanted weeds are appearing. The garden of course is really a metaphor for our heart and the relationship we have with the Master Gardener, God himself. Accordingly, our three readings are designed to colour what we hear, say, do, so that our harvest will truly reflect the promised hundredfold. Our 1st Reading invites us to notice the splendid qualities of our God-Gardener justice, strength, protection which inspire hope - and learn from them. In the 2nd Reading we learn that it is the Spirit who presides and gives life and meaning to our labour. The Gospel brings our lessons to a climax and reminds us that the key is deep listening. Anyone who has ears should listen! God will never fail to cast the seeds according to the season. We need fertile openness that is figured by good and productive soil. In this way our garden will shine like the sun. Try to imagine a world where everybody's garden is fully blooming. May the Spirit in us pray for the coming of such a kingdom.

"WHEN ALL THINGS WORK TOGETHER ONTO GOOD." (Rom. 8:28): We can sum up Jesus' mission in the world by saying that he came to teach us a new way of thinking. All three readings today conspire to demonstrate what will happen if we choose Jesus' way. When Solomon was told by God to ask for anything he wanted, he did not think of himself but of the people he was called to lead. Accordingly he asked for wisdom and understanding. God granted his wish, of course, and added other blessings too. Our 2nd Reading aims at removing our worries by pointing out that all things work together onto good for those who love God. The blessings which overflow in our 1st and 2nd Readings are characteristic of those who think differently. It is a hidden treasure waiting to be discovered. It is apearl of great price, really worth having. It is as a net, encompassing the whole world and all the people. But only those with open eyes will choose to remain there. Let us listen to Jesus' concluding question: 'Do you understand?" and we say "yes".




