Reflections from Fathers Desk... x 2

I SPEAK THUS THAT YOUR JOY MAY BE FULL." (JN. 15:11):

The Jews, among many qualities, were very much waiting people. The God who chose them had entered into a covenant with them and had made a promise to send a Messiah. Our 1st Reading is one of many that celebrates this waiting. The people were invited to dance with joy because their king is coming. The promise from of old is going to be honoured. The Messiah will come in the person of Jesus. The people in Jesus' time no longer wait for a Messiah but for the fulfillment of a new promise - the coming of the Spirit. The Gospel presents us with one of Jesus' prayers. We get a glimpse of his inner heart as he thanks the Father for the unfolding of his wonderful plan that is revealed to mere children. Of Jesus' three favourite verbs, Come, Stay, Go, the first is at the heart of today's Gospel. Come to me . . . The reference to the yoke takes us back to Leviticus 26 where our God removes the yoke of slavery from the people. God is about freedom and joy and dancing. Our truest destiny is to live a life in the Spirit as Paul reminds us in the 2nd Reading. Let us be meek and humble and dance in our waiting.

Wait on God. When times seem difficult - just wait - spend quiet time with God and listen.

"BEHOLD, I MAKE ALL THINGS NEW." (REV. 21:15): Trinitarian life is a circle dance where the three persons are dynamically present to each other and dynamically present to the creation. Our world too is dynamic, not static. There is change, growth, newness. Our readings today speak of this newness in different ways. Just as does the rain, the word from God's mouth brings change and bears fruit. This is the theme of our 1st Reading. Paul in the 2nd Reading tells the Christians in Rome and now to us, that we, together with all creation, are waiting with eager longing for the transformation and newness that have been part of God's plan from the beginning. Paul's vision of where our world is headed is truly inspiring. Our Gospel Reading today is the parable of the sower describing the different ways in which people hear or don't hear God's word. We can get caught up in Paul's or God's vision [they are the same] all the more fruitfully if we open our minds and hearts to the word that God sows in them. It will help in our eco-conscious era if we realize that creation is neither our servant nor our slave it shares our planet and we are responsible for it. Let us help God create a 'new heaven and a new earth'.


